Engineer: Mr. Rodman reported that Sunset Lake Road (State Aid 2019) guiderail has been completed. This will be submitted as soon as they get the Certification signed by the CFO. There was no change in the status with the request to the County Engineer's office for placing a 4-way stop at the intersections of Route 521 Stillwater Road and Spring Valley Road. Bill Gleba, County Engineer said that a traffic count should be done in spring or summer, but they have not had any feedback yet.

The preliminary paperwork for Millbrook Stillwater Road project has been submitted and we have approval to proceed. The Committee will need to pass a resolution tonight to award the contract to Tilcon.

Lastly, State Aid for 2021 is due July 1, 2020. They have consulted with Tom Campbell and they will be submitting the application for Millbrook Stillwater Road Section 2.

There was still a question and Mr. Lavery noted that he pulled the old 2006 files and interpreted that there is no public assess. The Township has an easement to the cell tower. Mr. Perry talked about a path from the original Planning Board meetings that is not there. Questions was then why is the Township DPW maintaining this piece if it only opened to the Township and no one else. We should then stop cutting it. Rm. Carrazzone agreed.

RESOLUTION

2020-22 GOVERNING BODY CERTIFICATION OF THE ANNUAL AUDIT

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reviewed, as a minimum, the sections of the annual audit report entitled "Comments and Recommendations": and

WHEREAS, the members of the governing body have personally reviewed, as a minimum, the Annual Report of Audit, and specifically the sections of the annual Audit entitled "Comments and Recommendations", as evidenced by the group affidavit form of the governing body attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, such resolution of certification shall be adopted by the Governing body no later than forty-five days after the receipt of the annual audit, pursuant to N.J.A.C 5:30-6-5; and

WHEREAS, all members of the governing body have received and have familiarized themselves with, at least, the minimum requirements of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey, as stated aforesaid and have subscribed to the affidavit, as provided by the Local Finance Board; and

WHEREAS, failure to comply with the regulations of the Local Finance Board of the State of New Jersey may subject the members of the local governing body to the penalty provisions of R.S. 52:27BB-52 to wit"

R.S. 52:27BB-52: A local officer or member of a local governing body who, after a date fixed for compliance, fails or refuses to obey an order of the director (Director of Local Government Services), under the provisions of this Article, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, may be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or imprisoned for not more than one year or both, in additional shall forfeit his office.

James Irish, Inc: Proposal to spray Slabtown Creek Park for Invasive Species \$1400.00 Mayor Duffy, Mr. McKim and Mr. Canace walked the Park with Mr. Irish reviewing the areas that need spraying. The areas that will be done are from the parking lot – outside perimeter of the trail along the creek, check rock wall under drip zone along the field, back end of the field and old lane trace connecting to private field, trial into woods at base of steep slope, returning to Park Lot – edge of field, check open slope with old stumps, top of hill along path in woods and back down slope to Park Lot. All spray areas will be posted with company flags.

They will monitor plant growth pre application date and monitor herbicide control post spray and retrieve flags as necessary.

DISCUSSION

Resolution from Mayor Starrs, Knowlton Township:

Requesting Governor to release Discretionary Funds for Relief of Covi-19 Expenses for Warren County

2020-28 Requesting Governor Murphy Release Discretionary Funds for the Covid-19 Expenses in Warren County and their Municipalities

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act was passed by Congress with overwhelming, bipartisan support and was signed into law by the President on March 27th, 2020; and

WHEREAS, the CARES Act provided payments to State, Local, and Tribal governments navigating the impact of the COVID-19 outbreak in the following amounts to counties in NJ:

\$162,000,000 Bergen \$88,000,000 Camden Essex \$139,000,000 \$117,000,000 Hudson Middlesex \$143,000,000 Monmouth \$107,000,000 Ocean \$105,000,000 \$87.000.000 Passaic Union \$97,000,000

WHEREAS, On April 24, 2020, the President signed into law a second federal package of funding intended to provide relief from COVID expenses, known as the "COVID-19 3.5" relief package, which provided the following funds to NJ counties:

Atlantic \$704,535 \$8,310,445 Bergen Burlington \$876,000 \$2,186,348 Camden \$4,792,503 Essex Gloucester \$804,857 Hudson \$1,874,303 \$TBD Mercer Middlesex \$1,739,905 Monmouth \$2,348,328 Morris \$2,182,700 Ocean \$820,000 Passaic \$537,434 Somerset \$646,398 Union \$4,139,331

WHEREAS, Warren County and their respective municipalities have not yet received any federal funding despite being located in the so-called "hot" region of the COVID-19 outbreak and despite having case counts of Covid higher than many counties that were awarded funds through antiquated and pre-determined formulas; and

WHEREAS, as part of the CARES Act, the State of NJ received certain non-entitlement funding through the CDGB (\$4 million) and ESG (more than \$11 million) that could be used for discretionary needs throughout the state; and

WHEREAS, on April 4, 2020, Congressman Josh Gottheimer and Senator Steven Oroho wrote to Governor Murphy requesting that these discretionary funds be allocated to Warren and Sussex Counties and their respective municipalities; and

WHEREAS, to date plans for those discretionary funds have not been announced; and WHEREAS, to date Warren County has spent \$919, 849 on operations of a COVID-19 testing facility for New Jersey residents; and

WHEREAS, as part of the plan to re-open the state, the Governor has asked for increased COVID-19 testing, but Warren County's testing site must cease operations at the end of May due to the total lack of federal or state funding.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Township Committee of Hardwick hereby requests that Governor Murphy allocate discretionary funds to the County of Warren for the reimbursement of expenses related to its significant number of Covid-19 cases and to aid with the Governor's goal of continuing and increasing testing required for the re-opening of the state.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be sent to Warren County's federal delegation with a request for their support and advocation for New Jersey residents who reside here.

Mr. Perry: spoke about several conference calls with the League and gave updates; also talked about several new bills that are before the Congress and Senate.

Mayor Duffy: Reviewed the statistics that he receives from the County on the numbers of Covid-19 positives for Warren County. He reminded all that the best prevention is safe distancing and staying home.
